



## Frequently Asked Questions – Adventure Activity Qualifications

## What Qualifications are Appropriate for Leading or Advising on Adventure Activities?

Anyone leading an adventure activity should have their competence confirmed by a robust verification process, such as:

- holding a leadership/coaching award at an appropriate level;
- being 'signed off' by a suitably qualified technical adviser appointed by the employer, based upon relevant qualifications, training and/or experience.

Several awarding bodies provide guidance about their qualifications, including matrices which show which qualifications are appropriate for leading or advising on various activities. These include the following:
